Our sustainable procurement commitments are mainly measured against <u>SDG 12</u> (Responsible Consumption and Production) and <u>SDG 13</u> (Climate Action). Iress is committed to complying with the *Modern Slavery Act 2015* (UK) and the *Modern Slavery Act 2018* (Cth) (an Australian Act).

Through our supplier due diligence process, we are committed to screening our material suppliers against indicators that address human rights, labour practices, environmental practices, consumer issues and fair operating practices, through our legal, information security and sustainability (environmental and social) assessment

Through our own continuous improvement processes we are committed to:

- Measuring and monitoring supplier risk
- Encouraging our suppliers to adopt sustainable practices where necessary
- Continuously improving our understanding of developments in sustainable procurement, implementing best practice processes and procedures accordingly
